





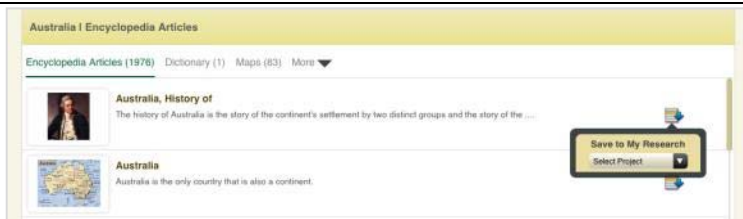

> In the **Save My Research** box tap the drop-down arrow and tap **Australia**.

ENCYCLOPEDIA ARTICLE:

> Tap on **Encyclopedia Articles** – then tap on the **Australia** encyclopedia article.

Explore the following tabs to help you navigate an encyclopedia article:



Article contents drop-down menu takes you to each section of the article.



The **Tools** box drop-down menu includes options to print, email, and save the article (in HTML and PDF formats). You can also view citations, translate the text, highlight a search term, adjust text size, and view in sections or a single page. The default article view is the single page view; click the "Section view" link to view the article by section.

Images, Videos, and Audio

Images, Videos, and Audio tab includes photos and illustrations, maps, videos and sounds.

Related Information

The **Related Information** tab lists content related to the article, including more encyclopedia articles, books, Back in Time articles, Special Reports, websites, magazine articles, content standards, and questions.

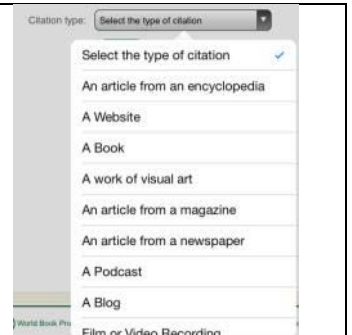
> Tap on **Citation Builder**

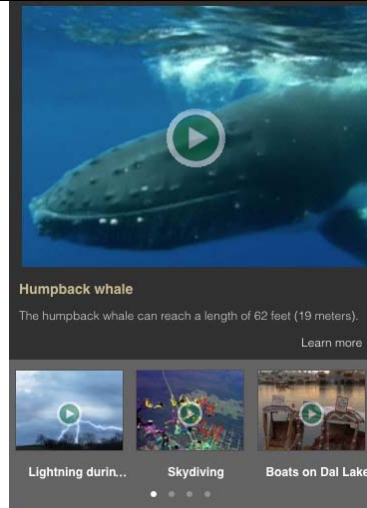
Featured videos from the extensive multimedia collection appear on the homepage with a brief description.
